  - It is refreshing to note Paul's <u>positive</u>, <u>faith-filled</u> <u>outlook</u> when facing difficult.
- 2. He could see what problems can NOT do to him.
  - **☞ Romans 8:38-39**
  - Regardless of what the future holds for him:
    - He is looking forward to a <u>productive ministry</u>
      1:22-23
    - Especially to the Philippians 1:24-26
